

For this performance, the climax of its 20th anniversary programme, and preceded by an exhibition of archive images, film, and costumes, Café Reason returns to its first-ever venue, the iconic Freud café, with its unique architecture and atmosphere, licensed bar and tempting menu, for a creative and celebratory evening.

CAFÉ REASON is an experimental performance group specialising in butoh — an iconoclastic dance form that originated in post-war Japan. Constantly innovating, the group seeks to extend the boundaries of perception and the interpretation of human experience.
